## **Cannabis and Hemp Smoking**

CANNABIS AND HEMP SMOKING  
ORDINANCE NO. 130**

An Ordinance to promote and conserve the public safety, health, peace, convenience, and welfare on properties owned by or under the supervision and control of the Metropolitan Airports Commission; establishing rules of conduct and regulating the activities of persons thereon; prohibiting the smoking of cannabis, hemp, and other related products; providing the penalty for violations thereof.

The Metropolitan Airports Commission does ordain:

**Section 1 - Definitions.**

Artificially derived cannabinoid, cannabis flower, cannabis product, and hemp-derived consumer product shall have the respective meanings defined in Minn. Stat. § 342.01 (enacted in Laws of Minnesota 2023, Chapter 63).

Commission means the Metropolitan Airports Commission, a public corporation organized and operating under Minnesota Law.

Electronic delivery device means any product containing or delivering a substance through inhalation of aerosol or vapor from the product.

Public place means property owned, leased, or controlled by a governmental unit and private property that is regularly and frequently open to or made available for use by the public in sufficient numbers to give clear notice of the property's current dedication to public use.

Smoking means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted or heated product that is intended for inhalation. Smoking includes using an electronic delivery device.

**Section 2 – Prohibition on Smoking.**

On properties or in public places owned by or under the supervision and control of the Commission, no person shall smoke any cannabis flower, cannabis product, artificially derived cannabinoid, or hemp-derived consumer product.

**Section 3 – General Provisions.**

1. Penalty. Violation of this Ordinance is a petty misdemeanor. In addition, anyone violating this Ordinance may be removed from Commission property.
2. Provisions Severable. If any part or parts of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional, such unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance. The Commission hereby declares it would have passed the remaining parts of this Ordinance if it had known that such part or parts thereof would be declared unconstitutional.
3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and take effect on January 1, 2024.
